Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates a good understanding of the safeguarding procedures. She knows how to identify if a child is at risk of abuse or being drawn into extreme behaviours or ideas. She knows how to report any concerns about a child's welfare.
- The childminder knows how to make observations and assessments of children's development. She demonstrates a good knowledge of how to plan age-appropriate next steps to support children in their learning.
- The childminder understands her responsibility to complete the progress check at age two. She knows how to share this with parents and professionals.
- The childminder continues to evaluate her own setting to identify her strengths and areas for development. She explains how she researches areas of child development to help her plan for children's learning.
- The childminder describes how she plans to settle new children into her provision to ensure that they feel safe. She recognises the importance of building strong partnerships with parents to ensure a good two-way flow of communication.
- The childminder values opportunities for children to explore the local community and the world around them. She describes how she intends to offer children opportunities to visit National Trust gardens, the park, the seaside and the local library.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector talked to the childminder about how she plans to keep children safe and protect them from potential harm.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to meet children's individual needs and plan for their learning.
- The inspector discussed the records the childminder plans to keep when childminding.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her processes for self-evaluation and her improvement plan.

The childminder registered in 2004 and lives in Banstead, Surrey. The childminder operates her service Monday to Friday from 8am to 6pm, for most of the year. The childminder holds an appropriate early years qualification at level 3.
