Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates a suitable knowledge and understanding of the educational programmes and how to promote the learning and development of young children. She describes how she observes and assesses children and uses the information gained to plan for the next steps in their learning.
- The childminder uses professional development, such as online training, to help her keep her knowledge and skills up to date.
- The childminder's home is well organised, safe and suitable for children. She has a wide range of toys and craft materials that are stored in ways that children can easily access. The childminder is able to describe how she will adapt activities to promote the learning of children of different ages.
- The childminder is aware of her responsibilities to safeguard children and keep them safe from harm. She demonstrates a suitable understanding of the procedures to follow should she have any concerns about a child's safety or welfare. She ensures her knowledge is up to date and in line with current guidance and legislation.
- The childminder demonstrates a commitment to involving parents in their children's learning. She understands the importance of sharing information and working in partnership with other providers, schools and professionals to support children's progress.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
