Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her responsibility to keep children safe and protect them from harm. She knows how to recognise and report any child protection concerns.
- The childminder is aware of how to support children's health and well-being. She describes how she encourages children to be active and benefit from a healthy lifestyle.
- The childminder describes how she offers a wide variety of activities to support children's learning and help them make progress. She understands how to assess children's development and help prepare them for starting school.
- The childminder explains how she helps children learn to value one another and behave well.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working closely with parents and any other settings involved, to help provide continuity for children in their learning and care. She describes how she shares information on a day-to-day basis.
- The childminder reflects on her practice and keeps her childcare knowledge and understanding up to date, for instance, by attending training and researching new ideas.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector talked to the childminder about how she will keep children safe and protect them from potential harm.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder about how she will meet children's individual needs, plan for their learning and share information with parents and other settings.
