

## **Compliance action taken for childcare provision**

### **Summary of outcome**

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at [www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2](http://www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2). If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right. On 23 January 2019 we carried out an inspection. The provider received an outcome judgement of inadequate. We have served a Welfare Requirements Notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 22 February 2019:

ensure managers have an effective induction to enable them to understand their role and responsibilities,

update knowledge and understanding and seek appropriate training around the role of lead practitioner for safeguarding to ensure that any concerns about a child are referred to the appropriate agencies without delay,

improve the effectiveness of staff deployment to meet children's care and learning needs and ensure their safety at all times, with particular regard to supervising children effectively in the garden,

ensure leaders have a good understanding of the early years foundation stage requirements and, in particular, there is a named deputy in place to support staff in the manager's absence.

On 25th February 2019, we conducted an unannounced visit and found that the provider had taken appropriate action to meet the actions raised.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
