Main inspection findings

Part 3. Welfare, health and safety of pupils

Paragraphs 7, 7(a), 7(b), 12, 32(1), 32(1)(c)

- The headteacher has ensured that arrangements are made to safeguard and promote the welfare of pupils at the school. These arrangements have regard for the most recent guidance issued by the Secretary of State.
- The school's safeguarding policy, which reflects the latest guidance, is available on the school's website.
- The most recent update of the school's fire risk assessment took place in November 2018. Fire risks have been appropriately assessed and appropriate control measures are in place. There are displays throughout both school buildings showing fire safety plans and evacuation procedures.
- The headteacher has ensured that the school's fire extinguishers were all checked in November 2018. The extinguishers are stored appropriately around both school buildings. For example, there is a carbon dioxide extinguisher located in the science room. Fire blankets are also accessible in the small kitchen areas at both school sites.
- The headteacher has ensured that there are records of termly evacuation drills. Pupils and staff confirmed that these drills frequently take place. Records show that there are weekly checks to ensure, for example, that the fire alarm and emergency lighting are functioning correctly.
- Pupils and staff understand the procedures to follow should there be a fire alarm. Pupils and staff know the exit routes in both buildings. These routes are kept clear. Fire exit signs are in place above doors.
- The outcome of the fire safety audit carried about by Leicestershire fire service on both premises, in November 2014, was 'satisfactory'.
- The school meets the requirements of these independent school standards.



Part 5. Premises of and accommodation at schools

- The testing of a small number of portable electrical appliances is out of date in both school buildings. However, the headteacher is aware of this and plans are already in place to rectify the situation promptly.
- The headteacher has ensured that both school buildings are maintained to a standard such that, so far as is reasonably practicable, the health, safety and welfare of pupils are ensured.
- The school meets the requirements of this independent school standard.

Information about this school

- Brooke House Day School is a non-selective independent school in Cosby, near Leicester. It is located in the premises of a former primary school and a converted detached house, which is located on the opposite side of the road.
- The school is registered to admit up to 100 pupils in the age range three to 16 years.
- The school uses no alternative providers for the secondary-aged pupils.



Information about this inspection

- The Department for Education (DfE) commissioned this emergency fire inspection because the proprietor has not responded to the DfE's fire survey, sent to schools in July 2017 following the Grenfell Tower tragedy. The survey asked proprietors of schools to check buildings for cladding and, where appropriate, to arrange for cladding to be tested for the presence of specific flammable components. The school buildings are of brick construction and do not have any such cladding.
- This inspection was conducted without notice and was the first inspection following the school's standard inspection on 21–23 June 2016.
- During the inspection, the inspector held various meetings with the headteacher and undertook a telephone conversation with a fire safety officer from the Leicestershire fire service. He scrutinised a wide range of documentation relating to fire safety, including an up-to-date fire risk assessment.
- The inspector spoke informally with two groups of pupils and a member of staff. He toured both school sites, visiting all classrooms and rooms, accompanied by the headteacher.
