- The childminder understands how to support children's learning and development. She knows how to observe, plan and assess children's achievements to ensure they make progress and are prepared for their eventual move to school.
- The childminder demonstrates she understands how to plan activities that engage children's interests. She has a wide range of toys and resources to appeal to a variety of ages and stages of learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of working with parents and other settings children may attend to provide continuity in their care and learning.
- The childminder is aware of how to help children settle and develop their emotional well-being. She understands the importance of promoting children's good behaviour and social skills.
- The childminder knows the importance of her own continuing professional development to improve outcomes for children.
- The childminder understands the importance of promoting a healthy lifestyle. She knows how to provide opportunities for exercise and eating nutritious foods.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation.
