Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her responsibilities to safeguard children. She knows the procedures to follow should she be concerned about a child's welfare.
- The childminder has knowledge of how to promote children's development. She uses observations and assessments to closely monitor children's progress and to plan for their next steps learning.
- The home environment is welcoming and safe. The childminder has a variety of toys and resources to support children's play.
- The childminder understands the importance of providing an inclusive environment for children. She plans activities and opportunities to help teach children to value each other's differences, share and take turns. The childminder has knowledge of how to manage children's behaviour.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents to help provide consistency in meeting children's needs.
- The childminder knows the importance of evaluating her practice and provision and seeks the views of parents to help ensure her continual improvement.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she promotes children's learning and development in partnership with other settings.
- The inspector looked at the documents the childminder uses and discussed her policies.
- The inspector looked at the space available for childminding and the resources the childminder uses.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder to assess her knowledge of the early years foundation stage requirements.
