## Summary of key findings for parents

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has met the recommendation from the last inspection. She has developed her practice, for example, by completing relevant training.
- The childminder explained how she safeguards and protects children. She has completed relevant training and knows the procedures to follow to ensure children are safe.
- The childminder described her plans to share information with parents to ensure children's continuity of care. She has experience of working in partnership both with other settings that children attend and other professionals when children require additional support.
- The childminder knows how to support children's positive behaviour and she explained how she encourages them to value the diversity of each other.
- The childminder understands how children develop and learn. She has a range of toys and equipment and explained the benefit of stimulating activities, such as using sensory resources, to support children to make progress in their creative thinking and communication.
- The childminder has experience of working with assistants. She explained her procedures to support them in their role through effective supervision.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

### **Inspection activities**

- The inspector observed the areas of the premises where childcare will be provided.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she will deliver the educational programme for children and how she will plan suitable activities for children's age and stage of development.
- The inspector looked at policies and documents the childminder will use when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed methods the childminder uses to self-evaluate her service and her plans for the future provision for children.
- The inspector checked the evidence of the suitability and training of the childminder.
