## Summary of key findings for parents

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder shows an understanding of her responsibility to keep children safe and protect them from harm. She understands how to recognise and report any concerns about their welfare.
- The childminder understands the learning and development requirements of the early years foundation stage. For example, she explains how she intends to assess children's abilities and needs, and address any gaps in their development.
- The childminder recognises the value of working in partnership with parents, outside professionals and other early years providers. She knows this will help to ensure continuity and progression in children's learning and development.
- The childminder discusses how to manage children's behaviour and help children follow rules and boundaries, and respect each other's differences.
- The childminder knows how to evaluate her provision to help improve her practice and meet the needs of the children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector viewed the areas of the childminder's home used for care purposes and looked at the play equipment and resources available for use.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about her knowledge of the requirements of the early years foundation stage.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she will meet children's individual needs and share information with parents, other professionals and other settings that children attend.
- The inspector talked to the childminder about how she will keep children safe and protect them from potential harm.
- The inspector checked a range of documentation, including the suitability checks of adults living and working on the premises, training certificates and policies.
