

## **Compliance action taken for childcare provision**

### **Summary of outcome**

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at [www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2](http://www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2). If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right. On 25 February 2019 we completed an inspection and found that the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. We served a Welfare Requirements Notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed:

ensure rigorous risk assessments are conducted routinely so that potential hazards can be identified and risk to children minimised;

with particular regard to ensuring items are not being unsafely stored where children are playing, by 9 April 2019

ensure that all toys, resources and areas of the home that are accessible to children are safe, clean, fit for purpose and suitable, by 9 April 2019

develop understanding of significant events that must be notified to Ofsted, by 9 April 2019

We also served a notice to improve that requires the provider to take the action below:

provide children with an enabling environment where resources are easily located and accessible to help to extend play and learning, by 9 April 2019

On 11 April 2019 we conducted an unannounced visit to the provider. We found that they had taken the appropriate action to meet the actions set.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
