This is a privately-owned children's home. It is registered to provide care and accommodation for up to four children or young people.

# This monitoring visit

A compliance notice was issued following the interim inspection on 22 January 2019. This was due to regulatory shortfalls related to the leadership and management of the home.

Ofsted carried out this monitoring visit to assess how effective the provider had been in promoting improvement. The requirements made at the full inspection were not monitored at this visit and will be reviewed at the forthcoming full inspection.

This visit identified that improvements have been made in relation to leadership and management arrangements.

The provider has put in place effective systems to monitor and review significant incidents in the home. This oversight will enable managers to identify concerns about young people's safety and then act promptly on those concerns.

There have been no new admissions since the last monitoring visit. However, the provider has revised the admissions process to ensure that there is clear accountability and management oversight. The changes provide an improved process for assessing the compatibility of children and young people admitted to the home.

The provider is in the process of reviewing staff training and development needs. Performance monitoring systems have improved. These improvements will ensure that day-to-day care is provided by suitably experienced and qualified staff, which

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will promote the welfare of children.

There are clear arrangements in place to ensure that young people have appropriate education placements. The home's model of care intends to be more education-focused.

The provider has demonstrated clear evidence of improvement and has met the steps of the compliance notice. The progress identified at this monitoring visit will be reviewed at the next full inspection.

This relates to reducing risks regarding drugs and alcohol misuse; the provision of key-work sessions; educating young people on the risk of harm; providing a consistent staff team; maintaining consistency in staff's managing of boundaries.

that the premises used for the purposes of the home are designed, furnished and maintained so as to protect each child from avoidable hazards to the child's health.

The care planning standard is that children— receive effectively planned care in or through the children's home; and	13/03/2019
have a positive experience of arriving at or moving on from the home.

that each child's relevant plans are followed.

Schedule 4 sets out the other information that the registered person must keep in relation to a children's home.	13/03/2019
The registered person must—	
maintain in the home the records in Schedule 4;	
ensure that the records are kept up to date; and	
retain the records for at least 15 years from the date of the last entry.

This specifically relates to the retention of staff rotas.	



#### Recommendations

- The registered person should also establish whether the units completed in the candidate's original qualification have content which corresponds with the units of the Level 3 Diploma for Residential Childcare; and/or the Level 5 Diploma in Leadership and Management for Residential Childcare. They should consider the relevance of the units of any original qualifications to the care of children as described in the home's Statement of Purpose. ('Guide to the children's homes regulations including the quality standards', page 68, paragraph 1.2)
- The registered person should keep a record of the information they have considered to establish 'equivalence'. ('Guide to the children's homes regulations including the quality standards', page 68, paragraph 1.3)
