

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right. On 29 November 2018 we carried out an inspection and found that this provider was not meeting some of these requirements. We have served a Welfare Requirements Notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed.

implement robust systems to check that staff are suitable to work with children. To be completed by 7 January 2019.

put in place appropriate systems to ensure that staff understand their responsibility to disclose any matters that may affect their ongoing suitability to work with children. To be completed by 7 January 2019.

ensure all staff are trained to understand the setting's safeguarding policies and procedures and have an up-to-date knowledge of safeguarding issues, with particular regard to the 'Prevent' duty guidance for England and Wales 2015. To be completed by 7 January 2019.

implement effective procedures to identify, assess and remove or minimise risks to children, with particular regard to babies being able to access equipment which is not appropriate for their age. To be completed by 7 January 2019.

put arrangements in place for the effective supervision of staff and provide support, coaching and training to help them develop their knowledge and skills so that they can provide children with high-quality care and learning experiences. To be completed by 7 January 2019.

ensure all children have access to outdoor play on a daily basis. To be completed by 7 January 2019.

arrangements have been reviewed and put in place to support staff's knowledge and understanding, skills and practice. However, these are not yet fully embedded to have had a consistent and full impact on the quality of teaching overall. To be completed by 7 January 2019.

improve the organisation of activities and daily routines to ensure children benefit consistently from planned and purposeful play and activities to promote their good progress in all areas of learning. To be completed by 7 January 2019.

Following a compliance visit on the 15 January 2019 we found that the provider had taken appropriate steps to meet with the actions served within the welfare requirements notice.

However, some aspects of other actions raised were not fully met. These will be further checked at the re-inspection. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
