

# Childminder report

## Summary of key findings for parents

### This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has failed to take all reasonable steps to ensure children in her care are not exposed to risks. She has not carried out risk assessments and has not kept her premises safe and suitable for children. This breaches the associated requirements of the Childcare Register.
- The childminder has failed to maintain relevant records. These include the name, home address and date of birth of each child and in addition, the name, phone number and home address of each parent. This breaches the associated requirements of the Childcare Register.
- The childminder has a secure understanding of safeguarding procedures and how to report her concerns to external agencies. She knows how to identify signs that a child may be at risk of extreme views and behaviours.
- The childminder shows an appropriate knowledge of how to observe and assess children and plan their next steps to help them develop their skills further. She knows how to implement the areas of learning of the early years foundation stage.
- The childminder understands how to work in partnership with parents and share children's progress with parents regularly.
- The childminder knows the importance of supporting children to respect and value each other's opinions and cultures.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## What the setting needs to do to improve further

### To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and Childcare Register the provider must:

- The inspector discussed safeguarding and welfare requirements with the childminder.
- The inspection was carried out as part of the risk assessment process.

The childminder registered in 2004. She lives in Romford in the London Borough of Havering. She operates her service all year round from 7.30am to 6pm, Monday to Friday, except bank holidays and family holidays.
