Summary of key findings for parents

This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder does not have a comprehensive safeguarding policy that outlines the correct procedures to follow if she has any concerns about a child's welfare. The policy in place is inconsistent with her verbal responses about how she will protect children from harm. Despite this, the childminder is generally able to demonstrate appropriate knowledge of how to keep children safe.
- The childminder has appropriate knowledge of children's learning and development requirements. She knows how to observe and assess children's progress and plan for what children need to learn next.
- The childminder knows how to gather information from parents when children start, and work with them to promote consistency of care.
- The childminder shows commitment to updating her professional development. For instance, she attends regular training and meets with other professionals. She understands the importance of regularly evaluating her provision to plan for future development.
- The childminder demonstrates that she understands how to support children to learn about healthy lifestyles. For example, she provides daily opportunities for children to be active and engage in exercise.
- The childminder displays a secure knowledge of how to promote positive behaviour and how to teach children to be respectful and aware of people's different backgrounds.
- The childminder has a broad range of toys and resources to cover the different areas of learning and support children's development.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and Childcare Register the provider must:
