## Summary of key findings for parents

### This provision does not meet requirements

- The manager has not ensured that there is a paediatric first aider on the premises and available at all times when children are present to respond to emergencies as quickly as possible. This means that children's safety and welfare are significantly compromised.
- Safeguarding is not effective. The manager does not have a secure knowledge and understanding of appropriate safeguarding practice and the procedures to follow should she have any concerns about a child in her care.
- The manager has not developed effective staff induction, supervision and support to help staff to improve practice and ensure they meet children's needs at all times.
- Staff do not record pre-existing injuries or follow the relevant procedures to share information with appropriate agencies when necessary.
- The manager does not complete robust risk assessments to promptly identify and minimise potential hazards and risks to children.
- The manager does not ensure that procedures for the safe use of mobile phones are implemented effectively at all times.
- Hygiene practice is poor. The manager does not ensure that good hygiene practice are followed to meet the health needs of children.
- Additional funding is used effectively, for example, the manager offers additional sessions to meet the needs of families.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## What the setting needs to do to improve further

### The provision is inadequate and Ofsted intends to take enforcement action:

Sunny Days Playschool And Pre School Ltd registered in 2017. The playschool and pre-school employs three members of childcare staff. Of these, two hold appropriate early years qualifications at level 2, including one who holds a qualification at level 4. The playschool and pre-school opens from Monday to Friday all year round. Sessions are from 8am until 6pm. The playschool and pre-school provide funded early education for two-, three- and four-year-old children.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
