## Summary of key findings for parents

### This provision meets requirements

- The management team understands how to promote children's health and well-being. It understands the importance of promoting healthy eating, and providing children with daily access to fresh air and physical activities outdoors.
- The manager knows how to undertake risk assessments and safety checks to identify and minimise potential hazards to children's safety.
- The management team demonstrates a good understanding of how to work with parents to evaluate the setting and plan for improvements.
- The manager understands safeguarding procedures and is knowledgeable of the signs and symptoms that may indicate that a child is at risk of harm. She is aware of the correct procedures to follow if she has concerns about a child's safety and welfare.
- The management team understands the importance of providing an inclusive environment. It knows to teach children to value their differences, understand their feelings and be kind.
- The manager knows how to plan and provide a range of activities for children to enjoy.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

### **Inspection activities**

- The inspector reviewed documentation, evidence of staff first-aid training and insurance documentation.
- The inspector held discussions with the manager regarding aspects of leadership and management.
- The inspector looked at the premises that are intended to be used by children.
