

# Childminder report

## Summary of key findings for parents

### This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has not met all the actions set at her last inspection. Although she has completed her first-aid qualification, she has not met the rest of the actions that were set.
- The childminder does not understand how to safeguard children. Although she has attended training, she still lacks knowledge of the correct procedures to follow in the event of a concern about a child's welfare. This was an action set at her last inspection which the childminder has failed to meet.
- The childminder remains unable to understand how she would support children's learning and development. She is not aware of how to track children's progress or plan activities to support children's learning. This action was set at the last inspection and has not been met. The childminder is not able to explain how she would meet children's individual needs and improve their outcomes.
- The childminder is able to explain how she would manage children's behaviour.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## What the setting needs to do to improve further

### The provision is inadequate and Ofsted intends to take enforcement action:
