Main inspection findings

■ The proprietor has provided additional schemes of work to cover the scope of the material change application. These schemes of work are appropriate for the age range 12 to 14. They take account of the age, aptitudes and needs of all pupils. They do not undermine fundamental British values.

- The proposed curriculum will provide fully for pupils' personal, social, health and economic education. It will also develop pupils' understanding of equalities and respect for the different cultures and faiths of others.
- The proposed curriculum will provide independent and impartial careers advice and guidance, helping pupils plan next steps in education, including work experience and future employment where appropriate.
- The proposed curriculum will enable pupils to learn and make progress. It will contribute to preparing pupils for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of life in British society.
- School leaders have ensured that all these standards are likely to be met if the material change is approved.

Information about this school

- Cherwell College was registered in October 2016 as a 14 to 19 non-selective, independent school with boarding facilities. The school is owned by Oxbridge College Ltd. The principal is also the proprietor.
- The school offers courses at A level and GCSE over one or two years as well as preparation for university, including Oxbridge. The school is spread over three sites which are near to each other.
- The first full standard inspection of the school took place in September 2017, when the school's overall effectiveness was judged to be good and all the independent school standards were found to be met.
- The proportion of pupils with an education, health and care plan is small. The proportion of pupils who speak English as an additional language is well above national averages.
- The school does not make use of any alternative provision.



Information about this inspection

- This inspection took place under section 162(4) of the Education Act 2002. It was commissioned by the Department of Education because of the proprietor's application for a material change to the age range of pupils at the school from 14–25 to 12–25.
- This is the first material change application since the school was first registered.
- Prior to the inspection, the inspector reviewed a range of curriculum documents submitted by the proprietor to support the material change application. The school's website was also checked, including the published safeguarding policy and other information.
- The inspector talked to the principal on the telephone prior to and during the inspection day.
