

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at

www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework-2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 12 April 2019, we received a concern detailing a safeguarding concern. On 7 May 2019 we carried out an unannounced visit. We found the provider had reviewed their behaviour management policy and staff supervision arrangements. However, we found that the provider was not meeting some requirements. We served a notice to improve. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

We issued a notice to improve that asked the provider to take action by 17 May 2019:

ensure the setting's policy and procedures on child protection are implemented effectively to safeguard children

improve knowledge of significant events that need to be notified to Ofsted

improve arrangements for behaviour management training, ensure these are effective in providing support, coaching and training, and enable staff to discuss any issues, particularly any child concerns.

The provider remains registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
