Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has recently accessed safeguarding training. She knows the signs to be concerned about in relation to child protection and knows what to do if she is concerned about a child's welfare.
- Risk assessments and visual checks are completed by the childminder to help her to identify and minimise any potential hazards. This helps to ensure the premises and outdoor areas are safe for children to use prior to them arriving.
- The childminder knows how to observe, assess and plan for children's next steps in learning. She intends to encourage children in their play and plans to cater for each child's individual needs.
- The childminder plans to help children to be aware of leading a healthy lifestyle and making suitable food choices. She plans to take children on outings to the park to help them to develop their physical skills and benefit from plenty of fresh air.
- The childminder knows and understands the importance of working together with parents and other providers that children attend. She plans to share information to help to support parents to continue children's learning at home.
- Recommendations raised at the previous inspection have been addressed. The childminder reflects on how she intends to improve her provision.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the childminder, and took account of evidence of the suitability checks and qualifications.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children and undertake observation, assessment and planning.
- The inspector discussed the policies and procedures with the childminder and viewed documentation that she intends to use when caring for children.
- The inspector had a tour of the areas of the premises used by children and discussed the equipment and toys available.
