## **Summary of key findings for parents**

#### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates a good knowledge and understanding of how to support children's learning and development. She understands the importance of identifying children's future learning and planning a variety of experiences to enhance their learning.
- The childminder has a clear understanding of her role in protecting children from harm and neglect. She demonstrates a good awareness of current guidance, including the 'Prevent' duty legislation. The childminder understands the procedures to follow to protect children in her care from harm.
- The childminder demonstrates a good awareness of how to promote children's understanding of diversity and the wider world. She is fully aware of the importance of supporting children's awareness of their behaviour and the impact it has on others.
- The childminder holds a paediatric first-aid qualification. She is fully aware of the appropriate procedures to follow when dealing with minor accidents, and maintains a stocked first-aid box.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents to support their children and to meet their individual needs. The childminder is knowledgeable of working with other early years settings that children may attend to promote continuity in care and learning.
- The childminder describes how she will gather the views of parents and children. She intends to use these to identify areas of strength in her provision and ways to enhance it further.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

#### **Inspection activities**

- The inspector viewed the areas of the premises available for use by children and discussed the equipment and toys the childminder plans to use with them.
- The childminder discussed policies and procedures with the childminder and viewed documentation that she intends to use when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage.
- The inspector checked a range of required documentation, including suitability checks of adults living on the premises, training certificates and policies.
- The inspector discussed how the childminder intends to use self-evaluation.
