## Summary of key findings for parents

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to safeguard children. She knows what to do if she has concerns about a child's welfare. She knows how to risk assess her home and outdoors to help to keep children safe.
- The childminder understands how to provide a suitable learning environment, activities and resources for children. She knows how to monitor their progress and plan for their next stages, including their move to school.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents, to help keep them informed and share information about their child.
- The childminder understands how to manage children's behaviour appropriately and protect children's welfare and care needs. She knows how to provide a healthy diet and recognises the importance of regular physical play.
- The childminder understands the importance of reflective practice to make ongoing improvements.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector viewed all areas of the home used for childminding and the resources available.
- The inspector looked at documents that the childminder will use, including suitability checks and policies and procedures.
- The inspector discussed self-evaluation and continuous development with the childminder.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the requirements.

The childminder registered in 1992 and lives in the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea. She operates all year round from 6.30am to 6.30pm, Monday to Sunday, except for bank holidays and family holidays. The childminder offers occasional overnight care.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.
