

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right. On 18 January 2019 we received a concern about the safety in the setting. The provider also notified Ofsted of the concern. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the early years foundation stage welfare requirements to notify Ofsted of a significant event. We conducted an unannounced visit, where we issued the provider with a welfare requirements notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider remains registered with Ofsted

improve safety in the nursery through robust risk assessment and by increasing staff awareness of the hazards that pose a risk to children's health and safety

ensure staff with lead responsibility for safeguarding have a clear understanding of the criteria for reporting and referring safeguarding concerns

improve the procedures in place for accidents, to ensure that parents are informed of any injury sustained by the child as soon as reasonably practical after

improve staff induction procedures to ensure that staff have the necessary skills and knowledge to carry out their role and responsibilities, with particular regards to health and safety, administering of first aid and managing staff.

We carried out a further visit. The provider had taken appropriate action to address the identified breaches in requirements. A full inspection took place shortly afterwards, where

the provider received a good judgement. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
