## Summary of key findings for parents

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a suitable knowledge of safeguarding. She is aware of the signs, symptoms and indicators of abuse and what to do, should she be concerned about a child's welfare.
- The childminder is aware of how to observe and assess children's development and how to plan for their individual needs. She demonstrates a good understating of how children learn.
- The childminder understands the importance of teaching children about positive behaviour. She demonstrates a strong understanding of how to offer an inclusive childcare service.
- The childminder demonstrates a strong commitment to self-evaluation. She is aware of the strengths of her setting and wants to improve her professional practice further through training.
- The childminder understands the importance of partnership working. She intends to keep parents informed of their children's progress and has already established effective links with the local school.
- Visual risk assessments of the premises are carried out to ensure that everywhere is safe and suitable for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver educational programmes for children and undertake observation, assessment and planning.
- The inspector discussed safeguarding and welfare requirements with the childminder. She checked the evidence of suitability for all adults living in the home.
- The inspector viewed the areas of the home that are intended to be used for childminding.
- The inspector looked at a selection of policies and certificates kept by the childminder.
