

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right. On 11 April 2019 during an inspection of the nursery we found that this provider was not meeting some of these requirements. We served a Welfare Requirements Notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out.

Actions needed

- implement an effective key-person system, to ensure that every child's personal care and learning are tailored to their individual needs by 10 May 2019
- ensure that risk assessments are regularly and thoroughly conducted, taking all necessary measures to minimise or remove any potential hazards to children in the setting by 10 May 2019
- ensure an accurate daily record of children's hours of attendance is kept by 10 May 2019
- provide regular supervision, training and coaching to all staff to help improve their skills and teaching and to improve the accuracy of their assessments and quality of planning, to meet children's learning and care needs by 10 May 2019
- work in partnership with parents to ensure they know what their child will be learning next, to support continuity of learning between the child's home and the nursery by 10 May 2019.

On 14 May 2019 we visited the provider to monitor their response to the welfare requirements notice and found that satisfactory action had been taken and the provider now meets the requirements. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
