

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right. On 28 March 2019, we inspected the provider and found they were not meeting some of these requirements. We served a Welfare Requirements Notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed:

Ensure vetting and recruitment procedures are robust and ensure the suitability of all staff (Suitable people). To be completed by 18 April 2019.

Ensure that practitioners who are designated to take lead responsibility for safeguarding children complete a child protection training course relevant to that role. (Child protection). To be completed by 9 May 2019.

Provide more opportunities for younger children to explore, experiment and express their creativity. To be completed by 18 April 2019.

Improve the quality of teaching so that staff use children's next steps for learning to provide more-purposeful challenge and interest for children's learning. To be completed by 18 April 2019.

Following a compliance visit on 5 June 2019, we found that the provider had taken appropriate steps to meet with the actions served within the welfare requirements notice. The provider requested a change to her registration to offer out-of-school day care only. The actions related to children's learning and development are not relevant to out-of-school provision, and were therefore not monitored at the compliance visit. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
