**Overall outcome** 

The school is likely to meet the relevant independent school standards if the material change relating to the school provision is implemented

### Main inspection findings

Part 3. Welfare, health and safety of pupils

Paragraphs 7, 7(a), 7(b) and 32(1), 32(1)(c)

- The school's approach to safeguarding pupils continues to meet the requirements of the independent school standards.
- Staff at all levels are suitably inducted and trained. Any concerns are raised quickly and shared with those responsible for safeguarding. All concerns and referrals are thoroughly documented.
- Leaders have a strong understanding of the various risks which their pupils face.
- There is a culture of vigilance, and a shared commitment to keep pupils as safe from harm as possible.
- The school's policy reflects the latest statutory guidance issued by the Secretary of State, and is published on the school's website.
- Leaders ensure that all relevant vetting checks are undertaken for those who come into contact with pupils. All recruitment checks are recorded accurately on the school's single central register, which meets all current requirements.

Paragraphs 11, 12, 14, 16, 16(a) and 16(b)

- Leaders ensure that the school's health and safety and risk assessment policies are effectively implemented. The building and facilities are clean, safe and well maintained. Risk assessments relating to the premises, classrooms, individual pupils, use of local facilities and educational trips show that due consideration is given to possible risks. Specific actions are taken to reduce risks so as to ensure that pupils are kept as safe as possible.
- Leaders ensure that the school complies with the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005. All the required checks are undertaken and logged by the school's site manager. These include checks on the fire alarm system, fire safety equipment and emergency lighting. Regular fire drills are conducted and recorded.
- There is likely to be an appropriate deployment of staff to ensure that pupils are



safely supervised. The minimum ratio is one adult to every five pupils.

■ Leaders have ensured that the independent school standards in this part are likely to continue to be met if the material change is implemented.

#### Part 5. Premises of and accommodation at schools

### All paragraphs

- The school's premises are clean, safe, secure and well maintained. There are specialist classrooms and social spaces over four floors. These include dedicated areas for primary-aged pupils, and pupils with autism spectrum disorder. The building can comfortably accommodate up to 100 pupils.
- The health, safety and welfare of additional pupils are likely to be assured through the effective implementation of the school's health and safety policy and procedures.
- The requirements in relation to toilet and washing facilities, changing rooms and showers are likely to be met in light of an increase in number.
- The requirements in relation to medical care and first aid are likely to be met as the medical room meets requirements. However, its location is not ideal, and leaders plan to relocate it as part of building works this summer.
- The acoustic conditions, sound insulation and internal and external lighting are suitable throughout the premises.
- Suitably labelled drinking water is available throughout the school day from water coolers, and the temperature of hot water supplies is safely regulated.
- Physical education and outdoor recreational time is made available to all pupils using nearby parks and leisure facilities, which are appropriately risk assessed.
- Leaders have ensured that all the independent school standards in this part are likely to continue to be met if the material change is implemented.

### Part 8. Quality of leadership in and management of schools

Paragraph 34(1), 34(1)(a), 34(1)(b) and 34(1)(c)

- The school's leaders have a secure understanding of the independent school standards. They have ensured that all the relevant standards related to the requested material change, including the standard in this part, are likely to continue to be met.
- As a result, the request to increase the number of pupils on the school's roll from 75 to 100 is recommended.

- All pupils have an education, health and care plan. This is primarily for their social, emotional and mental health needs. Some have additional diagnoses and needs, such as autism spectrum disorder.

- Pupils are placed and funded by a range of local authorities.
- The school is part of, and governed by, the Kedleston Group. This is overseen by a board of directors, and led by a chief executive officer.
- The school currently makes use of one alternative provider: Ilderton Motor Vehicle Project, Deptford, London SE8 5HB.
- The school's most recent inspection was a full standard inspection in October 2018.



### Information about this inspection

- The inspection was commissioned by the Department for Education (DfE) to consider the school's application to make a material change to its registration.
- The DfE requested that the inspector consider whether particular independent school standards contained within Parts 3, 4, 5 and 8 are likely to be met if the material change is implemented.
- The inspector met with the headteacher, the director of quality and compliance, senior staff with responsibility for safeguarding, and the human resources officer. He toured the premises and reviewed relevant documentation in relation to health and safety, fire safety, risk assessment and safeguarding.
- The inspection took into account the eight recent responses to Ofsted's online survey (Parent View).
