Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her responsibility to safeguard children. She is aware of what steps to take and who to contact, should she have a concern about a child, in order to protect their welfare.
- The childminder understands the benefits of sharing information with parents and other professionals, to help provide a consistent approach to children's development and continuity of care.
- The childminder knows how to assess children's progress and to provide a range of interesting activities and resources. She understands the benefits of using children's own interests to engage them in their learning. For example, she uses numbered cars parked in garages to develop counting skills.
- The childminder understands the importance of updating her own professional knowledge and skills, and evaluating practice to help develop her service.
- The childminder knows how to support children's emotional well-being and learning needs. For example, she understands that children benefit from feeling safe and secure in her home.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector spoke with the childminder about her understanding of safeguarding, child protection, welfare and safety.
- The inspector assessed how well the childminder understands the requirements of the early years foundation stage.
- The inspector sampled documentation of planning and assessment, policies and procedures, risk assessments and the childminder's qualifications.
- The inspector viewed the parts of the childminder's home that she plans to use when caring for children.
