## Summary of key findings for parents

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a clear understanding of child protection procedures. She knows what action to take to keep children safe if there are concerns about their well-being.
- The childminder knows how to create a safe environment for children. She holds public liability insurance and a current paediatric first-aid certificate.
- The childminder recognises the importance of helping children to live healthy lifestyles through eating healthily, taking fresh air and exercise, and following effective hygiene procedures.
- The childminder knows how to plan for children's learning and care needs to help them prepare for school. She is aware of the need to identify any potential gaps in children's development and knows what to do to reduce these.
- The childminder demonstrates commitment to working in partnership with parents and other people involved in the children's development, to meet their individual needs.
- The childminder recognises the importance of taking account of feedback from children and parents to help her review her practice and keep her knowledge and skills up to date.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she plans to deliver the educational programmes for children.
- The inspector looked at the childminder's paperwork and viewed the areas of her home available for childminding.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she evaluates her practice, particularly in relation to safeguarding practices.
