

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right. On the 10 June 2019, we received a notification from the provider regarding safeguarding concerns. This notification means that the provider met their statutory duty to let Ofsted know of any significant events. We conducted an unannounced visit and issued a Welfare Requirements Notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out.

Actions needed

ensure that the premises is secure and fit for purpose, by the 19 June 2019.

take all reasonable steps to prevent unauthorised persons entering the premises, by the 19 June 2019.

improve safeguarding practices to ensure any safeguarding concerns about a child are notified to agencies with statutory responsibilities without delay, and in line with the Local Safeguarding Children Board procedures (LSCB), by the 19 June 2019.

take action to ensure all staff have up-to date knowledge of safeguarding issues and have regard to the government's statutory guidance 'Working Together to Safeguard Children 2015' and the 'Prevent' duty guidance to keep children and their families safe, by the 19 June 2019.

ensure that safeguarding measures given to management by other professionals are swiftly and appropriately followed to safeguard children, by the 19 June 2019.

The provider remains registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
