Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder is aware of the possible signs and symptoms of abuse and neglect, and is confident with the action that she needs to take if she has a concern about a child.
- The childminder understands how to provide children with an exciting learning programme which includes visits into the community, to the local park and to children's centres, where they take part in various group activities.
- The childminder understands how to monitor children's progress, assess their level of development and plan for their progression. She discussed how she would use information from parents, observations and photos to regularly assess children.
- The childminder is aware of how to promote healthy lifestyles to children, and spoke of her plans to cook fresh food daily for the children's meals. She and her co-childminder intend to continue their gardening project, growing produce in their garden with children and using this in their meals.
- The childminder demonstrates an understanding of the value of working in partnership with parents. She outlined her plans for a sensitive settling-in procedure, led by the needs of the child and their parents. She described how she intends to keep parents informed and involved in their children's learning.
- The childminder is part of a childminding network which shares information that is used to improve the quality of care and education in her provision.
- The childminder knows how to reflect on her practice. She recognises her strengths and areas to improve, and has identified areas that she would like to develop to support children's outcomes.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector looked at the rooms in the house used for childminding, the garden and the resource storage area.
- The inspector viewed a range of relevant documentation, policies and procedures.
- The inspector spoke with the childminder about her knowledge and understanding of the early years foundation stage, planning and assessment.
- The inspector looked at the resources that the childminder had available for children. The childminder also described the range of activities she would plan for each age group.
- The inspector checked evidence of the suitability of those living on the premises.
