Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has knowledge of how to safeguard and protect children in her care. She is familiar with the procedures to report any concerns and allegations to the relevant authorities.
- The childminder knows how to obtain feedback from parents and children to evaluate and improve her practice and children's experiences.
- The childminder understands the importance of maintaining her professional development in order to keep up to date with any changes in the sector and to keep her skills current.
- The childminder recognises the benefits of working with parents to share information about children's likes and dislikes, and to plan together what children should do next to support their development.
- The childminder understands how to observe and assess children's learning to identify their starting points. She knows how to use this information to provide opportunities to help them make progress with their development.
- The childminder knows how to settle children in her care. She understands how to support their personal development and physical well-being.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to provide activities and experiences that support children's learning.
- The inspector looked at the childminder's policies and documents that she intends to use when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's processes for self-evaluation and her improvement plan.
- The inspector viewed resources and had a tour of the areas of the childminder's home that she intends to use for childminding.
