## Summary of key findings for parents

#### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has addressed the actions raised at the last inspection. For example, she ensures that drinking water is available and accessible to children at all times.
- The childminder has a good knowledge and understanding of the referral procedures to follow, should she have concerns about the safety or welfare of a child.
- The childminder plans to use the information from observations of children's play to assess what they know and can do. She intends to plan challenging activities that interest children and help them to make good progress.
- The childminder plans to use positive praise and encouragement and play alongside children to teach them how to behave appropriately.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of teaching children about healthy lifestyles. For example, by eating a balanced diet and playing outside in the fresh air.
- The childminder is committed to providing an inclusive service. She has procedures in place to monitor children's progress so that she can quickly identify any gaps in their learning and seek external intervention, if necessary.
- The childminder understands the value of professional development and evaluating her practice. For example, since the last inspection, she has developed detailed action plans that clearly identify priorities for further improvement of her practice.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents, schools and other professionals to provide children with continuity of learning and care.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

#### **Inspection activities**

- The inspector carried out a tour of the premises and the garden with the childminder. She observed the resources, toys and equipment that the childminder intends to use when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder the safeguarding and welfare requirements. She looked at relevant policies, procedures and documents that the childminder intends to use when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children and undertake observation, assessment and planning. The inspector also discussed with the childminder how she plans to support children's play and learning.
- The inspector checked evidence of the suitability of the childminder and other adults living on the premises. She also checked the childminder's qualifications and discussed her self-evaluation and improvement plans.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she plans to work in partnership with parents, external professionals and schools that some children may also attend.

The childminder provides care in the school holidays each weekday from 8am to 6pm. She has an appropriate early years qualification at level 3. The childminder occasionally works with an assistant.
