This provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates that she understands what to do if she has concerns about a child's welfare. This includes referring any child protection concerns to the appropriate agencies and notifying Ofsted of significant incidents.
- The childminder is aware of how to assess for potential risks in her home and when outdoors to keep children safe. In addition, she is aware of the need to ensure that all adults in the home complete suitability checks.
- The childminder has knowledge and understanding of the learning and development requirements. She knows how to deliver educational programmes to help children make progress.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals to provide consistent care and learning to children.
- The childminder understands the importance of providing an inclusive environment for children. She plans to teach children to value each other's differences, share and take turns.
- The childminder recognises the importance of evaluating her provision and undertaking training to improve the quality of her practice.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector discussed the policies and procedures with the childminder and viewed documentation that she will use when caring for children.
