Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a good understanding of her responsibility to keep children safe from harm. She knows the procedures to follow to report any safeguarding concerns she may have about children in her care.
- The childminder demonstrates a sound knowledge of how to plan appropriate activities. She understands how to track children's progress to identify their individual learning needs and help them achieve the next steps in their development.
- The childminder understands how to manage children's behaviour appropriately and how to support children to develop respect for others who are different from themselves.
- The childminder understands the benefits of working closely with parents, and with other settings that children attend, to promote continuity in children's care and learning.
- The childminder reflects on her practice and identifies areas of improvement. She uses self-evaluation to reflect on future improvements and talks with other providers to share good practice.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
