Summary of key findings for parents

This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder fails to complete the required suitability check for all household members above the age of 16 years. This is a breach of the Early Years Register requirements and the Childcare Register requirements.
- The childminder has knowledge of child protection issues and how to report concerns to relevant authorities. However, she does not understand the latest legislation, with particular regard of how to recognise and prevent children from being exposed to extreme views and actions.
- The childminder does not understand the early years register assessment requirements. As a result, she does not know how to complete the progress check for children between the ages of two and three years.
- The childminder knows how to provide a range of opportunities for children to enjoy and to help them make progress. For example, she describes how she intends to use different activities, both indoors and outside to support children's learning and development.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working with parents to share information about children's needs and interests, and their daily care and experiences.
- The childminder understands how to support children's physical, personal and social development. She knows how to set boundaries to help teach them right from wrong.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and Childcare Register the provider must:
