

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at

www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right. On 13 June 2019, we carried out an inspection which judged the provider to be inadequate with enforcement action. We issued a Welfare Requirements Notice which is a legal notice that requires the provider to take action within the timescales set out. You can read the report and see the actions raised on our website.

On 2 July 2019, we carried out a monitoring visit to assess what action the provider has taken and ensure the welfare requirements notice has been met. It is an offence not to comply with an enforcement notice.

The inspector spoke to the provider and manager and found that appropriate action had started to be taken to meet the actions. The provider had reviewed and improved the procedures to ensure that people looking after children are suitable to fulfil the requirements for their roles. This was particularly in relation to meeting the children's needs and keeping them safe. The inspector spoke to the provider and reviewed the procedures now in place to ensure that staff with first-aid training respond in line with their training, to deal with injuries to children at the setting. Steps have been taken by the provider to improve the arrangements to support children who are not achieving at the expected levels. This includes seeking support from other relevant professionals in a timelier way. The inspector concluded that at this time, the provider has taken appropriate action to meet requirements.

The next step is a full inspection. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
