

## Compliance action taken for childcare provision

## Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at

www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right. On 22 May 2019 we carried out an inspection and found that this provider was not meeting some of these requirements. We have served a Welfare Requirements Notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

## Actions needed

implement robust induction procedures so that all staff have a clear knowledge and understanding of their roles and responsibilities. To be completed by 01 July 2019.

ensure that supervision is effective in promoting a culture of mutual support and teamwork, and to improve the quality of teaching to a consistently higher level. To be completed by 01 July 2019.

ensure that staff are deployed effectively in order for children's individual needs to be met. To be completed by 01 July 2019.

improve partnership with parents and maintain a regular two-way exchange of information to make sure they are involved and informed about their child's learning and development from the start. To be completed by 01 July 2019.

implement consistently, agreed strategies and provide clear guidance for children to promote their good behaviour. To be completed by 01 July 2019.

We are taking steps to cancel the provider's registration. The provider has a right to object to our intention to take the step.'

We completed a compliance visit on the 3 July 2019. During this visit we found that the actions within the welfare requirements notice and notice of action to improve had not been met in full. In addition, the provider had failed to notify Ofsted of a significant change to individuals associated with the provision. This is a further breach of the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage safeguarding and welfare requirements. We are now taking steps to cancel the provider's registration. The provider has a right to object to our



intention to take the step.'
