## Summary of key findings for parents

### This provision meets requirements

- The manager intends to reflect regularly on her practice and plans to seek the views of staff, children and parents to help improve the quality of her setting.
- The manager and staff know how to encourage children's good behaviour and support a healthy lifestyle. They intend to be good role models.
- The manager has a good understanding of the value of building relationships with the school children attend and knows how to work with parents and other professionals to ensure consistency in meeting children's individual needs.
- Since the last inspection the managers and staff have extended opportunities for quieter children to build their confidence in large-group activities. They have also enhanced children's opportunities for outdoor play.
- The manager recognises the importance of developing her and her staff's skills and keeping up to date with new guidelines, requirements and safeguarding knowledge. For example, she has a robust recruitment and vetting procedure for prospective staff to establish their suitability for the role and help keep children safe.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector viewed the premises.
- The inspector, regional manager and manager discussed their knowledge of safeguarding, risk assessments, children's needs and self-evaluation.
- The inspector viewed the resources and talked to the managers about how they would use these to help to motivate children.
- The inspector sampled documentation, including record-keeping, policies and procedures.

After School Club Womens Hall registered in 2012 and is located in Billingshurst, West Sussex. Sessions run from 3pm to 6pm, Monday to Thursday during term time only. The setting also runs a holiday club during the summer. There are four members of staff, two of whom hold relevant childcare qualifications at level 3 or above.
