Summary of key findings for parents

This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder cannot provide evidence that she has maintained her paediatric firstaid training. This breaches the safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The childminder has an excellent understanding of how to help all children learn and develop, including those with special educational needs and/or disabilities. She discusses the range of exciting activities she intends to provide to help children make good progress.
- The childminder recognises the importance of building secure relationships with children and their families. She knows how to gather information about children's specific care and dietary needs to promote their positive well-being and good health.
- The childminder knows how to establish partnerships with other professionals who are involved with children, such as teachers. She discusses how she will share assessments of children's progress to promote continuity of learning and prepare them for the next stage in their learning.
- The childminder understands how to protect children from harm. She has procedures to follow if she has concerns about a child's welfare and intends to complete thorough risk assessments indoors and outdoors.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What the setting needs to do to improve further
