Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The manager and his staff understand how to provide a welcoming and active club which helps to support local children and their families. They routinely reflect on their practice to identify areas for improvement. For example, new coat hooks mean children do not put their coats on the floor and have additional floor space to play.
- The manager and senior staff hold regular one-to-one meetings with staff to review their practice and training needs. They ensure that staff have current, up-to-date training in key areas, such as safeguarding.
- Staff are clear about the importance of liaising with other professionals within the school, as well as parents, to help promote positive relationships and consistency of care. Staff understand the need to encourage children to behave in a polite and respectful way.
- The manager and his staff understand the needs of young children. They plan engaging activities to complement the more formal learning in school. For instance, children recently 'camped' in play tents and completed nature treasure hunts. Staff supplement children's learning in school, such as by learning about the celebration of festivals from around the world, which helps to support their understanding of diversity.
- Safeguarding is effective. The manager and his staff understand the safeguarding and welfare requirements. They know the procedures to follow and the people to contact if they have a concern about a child's safety or welfare.
- Staff recognise the importance of providing a healthy diet and physical exercise, to help to support children's understanding of healthy lifestyles.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector had a tour of the premises used by the club and viewed the resources available.
- The inspector discussed with the manager and the coordinator how they plan to meet the needs of the children.
- The inspector reviewed documentation, including policies, staff qualifications and suitability, and children's records.
- The inspector held discussions with the manager and staff about their understanding of safeguarding procedures.
- The inspector discussed future plans for the club with the manager.
