

## **Compliance action taken for childcare provision**

### **Summary of outcome**

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at [www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundationstage-framework--2](http://www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundationstage-framework--2). If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right. On 1 June 2019 the provider notified us that a serious accident occurred in the setting. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the early years foundation stage welfare requirements to notify Ofsted of serious accidents that occur on the premises.

We visited the provider and have served a Welfare Requirements Notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by the 17 July 2019

establish effective recruitment and vetting arrangements to ensure that all required suitability checks, including additional checks when staff have lived or worked abroad, are completed on all staff

ensure paediatric trained staff respond swiftly to all incidents and accidents that occur and administer the appropriate first aid to children as required

keep a written record of accidents or injuries and first aid treatment

improve understanding of which agencies to contact should a child sustain a serious accident or injury

improve the effectiveness of staff supervision so that staff practice is monitored and appropriate support and training is given to staff to help them understand their roles and responsibilities, in particular when taking action in the event of an injury to a child and when administering first aid treatment

An unannounced visit was carried out on the 18 July 2019. We found that the provider had taken appropriate action to meet the welfare requirements notice. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

## **Publication of compliance action**

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
