Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates a good understanding of how to safeguard children and has arrangements in place to assure their safety. She knows what action to take and whom to report to if she has concerns about a child.
- The childminder intends to obtain initial and ongoing information from parents about children's individual learning and development. She knows how to plan appropriate activities, using children's interests and her knowledge of what they can already do. She describes how she would observe children's learning and share her assessment of their progress with parents.
- The childminder recognises the importance of establishing good partnerships with parents and others who may be involved in children's care or development. She plans to gather and share information about what children enjoy and achieve, to help prepare them for next steps in learning and for school.
- The childminder understands the value in providing for children's individual needs. She has completed training to update and enhance her knowledge and describes the actions she would take if children fall behind in their learning.
- The childminder maintains links with external practitioners and demonstrates a commitment to her professional development. The helps her to review her service.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector reviewed documents, including evidence of professional development and policies.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children and undertake observation, assessment and planning.
- The inspector looked at the areas of the premises that children will use and discussed with the childminder how she will undertake risk assessments for her home.
- The inspector discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the childminder.
