

## **Compliance action taken for childcare provision**

### **Summary of outcome**

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at [www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework](http://www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework). If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 4 April 2019 the provider notified us that a concern had been raised regarding an injury to a child and that other agencies had been notified. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the early years foundation stage welfare requirements to notify Ofsted of any significant event which is likely to affect the suitability of the early years provider or any person caring for children.

We carried out an unannounced visit to the premises on 18 April 2019. We have served actions. The provider is to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted. We also found that there had been a breach of the early years foundation stage in relation to the requirement special education needs. Through discussion the manager confirmed how she would ensure that deadlines for sharing information with other agencies would be met.

### **Actions needed**

ensure that you have the appropriate public liability insurance in place to cover all premises from which you provide childcare by 23 April 2019

ensure that all staff receive induction training to help them understand their roles and responsibilities. Induction training must include information about emergency evacuation procedures, safeguarding, child protection and health and safety by 25 April 2019

ensure a clear daily record is kept of the names of the children being cared for on the premises, their hours of attendance and the names of each child's key person by 25 April 2019

ensure that you record information about staff qualifications and the identity checks and vetting process that have been completed (including the disclosure and barring check, the date a check was obtained and details of who obtained it) by 25 April 2019

ensure that records are easily accessible and available by 23 April 2019

ensure that you obtain an enhanced disclosure and barring check in respect of every person aged 16 and over who works directly with children by 25 April 2019

An inspection was carried out where we monitored compliance with the actions set. The full report can be accessed online.

## **Publication of compliance action**

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
