Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a secure understanding of how to provide a challenging range of experiences to help children make good progress in their learning.
- She understands the importance of using observation and assessment to plan for children's learning. She has systems in place to monitor children's progress.
- The childminder has a good understanding of child protection and wider safeguarding issues and knows the procedure to follow if she has a concern about a child.
- She understands how to help children learn about diversity. She is confident about teaching children right from wrong and in tackling any negative stereotypes.
- The childminder understands the importance of working with parents and there are procedures in place to keep parents up to date about their children's learning.
- The childminder knows how to evaluate her own practice to maintain standards and develop the quality of her provision further.
- She has systems in place to share information with other settings that the children may attend to support continuity in their learning and development.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about how she intends to provide activities for children of different ages in order to meet their learning and development needs.
- The inspector sampled the childminder's policies and procedures.
