## Summary of key findings for parents

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a secure knowledge of safeguarding procedures. She knows the signs and symptoms of abuse and knows how to escalate potential concerns regarding a child's well-being.
- The childminder has a good understanding of the early years foundation stage requirements. She discusses how to meet children's care, learning and development needs to help them make good progress.
- The childminder provides a safe environment for children to explore. She explains how she supports children to learn about the world around them and care for plants and vegetables that grow in a natural garden space.
- The childminder values working in partnership with parents to improve overall outcomes for children. She discusses how she uses information from parents to help her plan for children's interests and abilities from the outset.
- The childminder reflects on practice and uses self-evaluation to continually drive improvement. She completes training and accesses a range of reading materials to develop her skills and knowledge.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector looked around the areas of the house and outdoor space that children access.
- The inspector sampled a range of documentation, including training certificates, relevant insurance and risk assessments.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her knowledge of the early years foundation stage.
