## Summary of key findings for parents

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to keep children in her care safe. She knows how to recognise that a child in her care might be at risk of harm or exposure to extreme ideas or behaviours. The childminder knows how to refer any concerns about a child's welfare.
- The childminder clearly understands the learning and development requirements of the early years foundation stage. She knows how to use her detailed planning to develop activities and build effectively on what children know and can do. She creates activities based on her observations of children's interests.
- The childminder provides a suitable environment for children's care. She uses risk assessments to help her keep children safe and well. The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and others involved in children's care and learning. She has strategies to meet children's needs effectively.
- The childminder has carefully considered how she will evaluate her provision and maintain her professional skills and knowledge.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector viewed the premises, including the outdoor area, that the childminder uses for the provision of her services.
- The inspector looked at documents the childminder will use when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver educational programmes for the children.
