

## **Compliance action taken for childcare provision**

### **Summary of outcome**

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at [www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2](http://www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2). If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 11 July 2019 we received a notification from the provider. Therefore, they had met their notification to Ofsted responsibility. On 31 July 2019 we conducted an unannounced inspection and judged them inadequate with enforcement. We served a welfare requirements notice which requires the provider to take the action below within the timescales set out.

We also suspended the provider's registration because we believed children may be at risk of harm. Suspension allows time for the provider to take steps to reduce or eliminate the risk of harm to children.

Action needed:

ensure that children are appropriately supervised to fully support their safety and well-being at all times, by 12 August 2019

ensure that risk assessments identify all possible hazards to children and take reasonable steps to minimise risks to support children's safety effectively, by 12 August 2019

On 13 August 2019 we conducted an unannounced visit and found that the provider had met the welfare requirements notice set. We lifted the suspension because the provider took appropriate action to deal with the matter that led to the suspension and we are satisfied that there is now no risk of harm to children. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
