

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

Outcome summary –

'All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right. On 5 July 2019 we received concerns that this provider was not meeting some of these requirements. We have served a Welfare Requirements Notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.'

Actions needed

- develop a greater understanding of your own safeguarding policy by increasing your knowledge about what to do if an allegation is made against a member of staff by 15/08/2019
- ensure children have access to fresh drinking water at all times 17/07/2019.
- ensure a written record of and complaints received and their outcome is kept by date 15/08/2019.

We visited the provider on 16 August 2019. The provider demonstrated a secure knowledge of what to do if an allegation was made against a member of staff. In addition, all children have access to fresh drinking water at all times. Furthermore, a written record of complaints received and their outcome is being kept. We were satisfied the provider had taken appropriate action to comply with the Welfare Requirements Notice. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the

enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
