

## **Compliance action taken for childcare provision**

### **Summary of outcome**

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at [www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2](http://www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2). If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 21 June 2019, Ofsted carried out an inspection which judged that the overall effectiveness of the setting was 'inadequate' and did not meet requirements of registration. Following our inspection, Ofsted served a welfare requirements notice on the provider that required them to take action to meet requirements. The full details of these breaches are contained in the published inspection report.

On 19 July 2019, we conducted an unannounced monitoring visit to the setting to assess compliance with the welfare requirement notices and notices to improve. We found the provider had taken appropriate action to ensure two of the four requirements were met. They had also made some improvement in regards to improving the key person system and staff understanding of safeguarding procedures. However, these require further improvement to ensure requirements are fully met. We have served a Welfare Requirements Notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take action within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

On 21 August 2019, Ofsted contacted the provider of the setting to assess compliance with the Welfare Requirements Notice. The manager was able to demonstrate how they are now meeting requirements. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider remains registered with Ofsted.
